Approve November 17th Executive Committee Minutes:

The Executive Committee (EC) unanimously approved the November 17th EC meeting minutes.

Strategic Planning:

There was a general discussion on the direction of RVA757 Connects. The following consensus was reached on the guiding tenets of RVA757 Connects' 2022 work:

1. Our Core Mission: Our core mission is relevant:

Improve the economic success and quality of life for everyone in the RVA and 757 regions.





- 2. What We Do: We identify, support, and advance major opportunities, initiatives, and projects that will meaningfully benefit our communities for generations to come – see next section.
- 3. How We Do It: There are many existing organizations already focusing their efforts on some of the same priorities as RVA757 Connects. We connect these organizations in a way that leverages everyone's work.
- 4. **Communications:** As a connector, we must be a great communicator. We must ramp up outreach and engagement.
- 5. Our Greatest Asset: Our core asset is our Board and MIC, an inclusive, mutually supportive network of leaders representing community, business, and higher education.
- 6. Our Current Capacity: Our work should always align with our organization's capacity. This means focusing on just a few priorities at a time. Supportive workgroups or committees may be helpful for 2-3 priorities.
- 7. Our Value Proposition: We need to deliver concrete, visible results to reinforce our value proposition. Given this commitment, we will not launch the Innovation Council or Higher Education Council at this time (in 2022).
- 8. What's Next: RVA757 Connects should be looking beyond current priorities and looking ahead toward the next big opportunity that will benefit both regions. We need to be the platform that people use to express what's next.

Key priorities for 2022 include:

The key priorities for 2022:

- Global Internet Hub: Advancing the I-64 Innovation Corridor as a top 15 Global Internet Hub.
- Renewable Energy: Support Dominion's Offshore Wind Project, which will not only connect the two regions, but also increase the interest of younger generations.
- Physical Connections: Continue to advance the I-64 widening, Virginia Capital Trail (BoAT), and James River barge traffic.
- Government Relations: Start a Government Relations Committee.
- Communications: Ramp up communications.
- MIC: Create a more active role for the MIC.



We will place the following priorities on hold until 2023:

- Innovation Council
- Higher Ed Council
- Healthier 757/RVA (Until 2023 with input from EC members).

Discussion on Agenda for December 8th Board/MIC Meeting:

The December 8th Board/MIC meeting will be held on the same day but at a new time. This meeting will be an opportunity to share what we accomplished during 2021, as well as our plans for 2022.

The EC agreed to invite Robert Blue, Chair, President and Chief Executive Officer of Dominion Energy, to share the progress of Dominion's Offshore Wind Project with the Board and MIC during this upcoming meeting.

Executive Session on SIR Compensation (without SIR):
