Virginia Passenger Rail Authority

- Created in 2020 by the General Assembly
- Given all powers necessary for carrying out its statutory purposes:
 - Manage passenger rail in Virginia
 - Design, build, finance, and maintain rail facilities
 - Direct recipient of USDOT Grants
- Partners with Amtrak and VRE to operate passenger and commuter rail service
- Governed by a 15-Member Board





Virginia Passenger Rail Network: 2023

- Four State-Supported Amtrak Routes: 8 daily roundtrips
 - Roanoke: 2
 - Richmond: 1
 - Newport News: 2
- Norfolk: 3
- Five Amtrak Long
 Distance Roundtrips
- One NC State-Supported Roundtrip
- Two Virginia Railway Express (VRE) Commuter Routes
- 16 daily roundtrips
 - Manassas: 8
 - Fredericksburg: 8





Virginia Supported Amtrak Ridership Setting Records

- July 2022 saw the introduction of the third daily roundtrip to Norfolk
- July 2022 also saw the reintroduction of the second daily roundtrip to Newport News
- August 2023 saw our largest state-supported ridership month with 130,998 riders





Virginia Supported Amtrak Ridership Setting Records

- In 2022, Virginia's state supported service set an alltime ridership record with 1,021,452 passengers, beating the previous high of 953,008 riders in 2019.
- 2023: 592,355 (January-June) 848,841 (January-August)
- In August 2023, our statesupported ridership had its biggest month ever, with 130,998 riders.





Current and Future Service

- Daily roundtrips, 2023:
 - Newport News 2
 - Norfolk 3
- Third daily roundtrip to Newport News will begin upon completion of Phase 1 projects, expected 2026.


Amtrak Airo Trains

Long Bridge Project Overview








Focus Areas – RO Interlocking to LE Interlocking

- 1. RO interlocking to Mt. Vernon Trail
- 2. Potomac River Crossings
- 3. WMATA Tunnel Portal & I-395 Crossings
- 4. I-395 to Ohio Drive SW
- 5. Washington Channel to Maine Avenue
- 6. Maryland Avenue Overbuild to LE

Long Bridge Project Work Progress

- Utility test pile work begins in October
- Plat development for property needs
- Stakeholder coordination
- Permitting outreach
- Construction contract procurement
 - North package construction begins Fall 2024
 - South package construction begins in 2025





Alexandria Fourth Track

- Construct a new fourth track from Alexandria station to Rosslyn interlocking
- Final design expected by end of 2023
- Utility relocation & property acquisition

CRISI Grant Award: Franconia-Springfield Bypass

- The Federal Railroad Administration awarded VPRA a grant of \$100 M for the Franconia-Springfield Bypass. The funding was distributed from the Consolidated Rail Infrastructure and Safety Improvements (CRISI) program.
- The 1.3 mile bypass structure will allow passenger trains to crossover to serve VRE stations on the west north of Franconia and on the east south of Franconia.
- Reduce conflicts between passenger and freight trains.
- Coordination with the third track project from Franconia to Lorton, including Newington Rail Bridge.



Newport News Transportation Center

- New multi-modal transportation hub near Bland Blvd and Jefferson Ave
- Anticipated completion Spring 2024
 - Level-boarding platform makes boarding easy for people with wheelchairs, luggage, bikes
 - Longer platform can accommodate up to 8-car trains
 - Baggage Claim for luggage
 - Passenger waiting room indoors with comfortable seating, charge ports, natural lighting
 - Connections for HRT buses and Amtrak Thruway Bus to/from Norfolk Amtrak station
- A layover facility for train cleaning, inspection, and overnight storage is being constructed a mile to the south of the station.
